They shared insights into their professions and conducted a session on health and hygiene. 


Swayan Sessions

Project Kavaad-Katha: A collaboration between Art and Languages

The students of Grade 4 took part in a five day long workshop on the art-from of Kavaad from 22nd to 26th April, 2024 in their respective classrooms. The tradition of storytelling with Kavaad boxes has its origins in Rajasthan and is over 500 years old. Supervised and assisted by the Art and Language teachers, students worked in groups under the guidance of Mr. Dwarka Prasad Jangid who is one of the few remaining artists and practitioners of this art-form. Mr. Jangid, along with his assistant, traveled from Chittorgarh, Rajasthan to visit CIS and work with the students, telling them about the history of this storytelling art-form and teaching them how to paint and assemble the Kavaad boxes from scratch.





This workshop, a first of its kind, was a collaboration between the Art and the Languages departments and saw the students illustrating stories from the regional languages Bengali and Hindi and also from the Foreign Languages French and Spanish, featuring popular and culturally significant folktales and legends. The workshop concluded with a presentation by the students in an assembly where each group, with the aid of the Kavaad, narrated the story illustrated by them.

The parents received an overview of the school and its operations. They were also informed about the upcoming Class Orientation programme, where they will receive detailed information about the class their children will be joining.




Students' Achievements
