

Fostering leadership Skills

Students of grades 3-5 attended a session on Leadership Skills with School Counsellors Mrs. Spriha Patronobis and Mrs. Sukonna Halder, on 29th July, 2024. The interactive session enabled students to identify leadership qualities that they value in their Role Models and how these qualities can also help students to assume various responsibilities in school. Hardworking, competent, problem solver, supportive, disciplined, multitasker, organized, calm, selfless, responsible, were some of the qualities mentioned by the students, among others. It was highlighted how leadership is not restricted only to the Student Council and that each student representing his/her class/house/school in any capacity is in a position to demonstrate leadership skills. Further, leadership also extends to each learner in their ability to adequately regulate themselves and collaborate with the student leaders for the school to function optimally.





Transitioning During Puberty

School counsellors Mrs. Sukonna Halder and Mrs. Spriha Patronobis conducted a session on 'Transitioning During Puberty' for the students of Grade 5. The session gave students the opportunity to explore some of the changes that adolescents experience during puberty and included information on body changes, periods/menstruation, mood swings and also how they can better manage their evolving independence, personal hygiene, understanding privacy and ways to manage their wellbeing. This also gave them an opportunity to share their concerns, and anxieties related to this as most of them are in the midst of their pubertal transitions. The session was conducted separately for the boys and girls so as to have more relatable discussions in a safe space, touching upon the changes the other gender may experience as well. This initiated the conversation about Puberty and is the beginning of a series of sessions on the topic to enable a well adjusted transition for all the students.

Mr Bansal captivated the audience with stories of his adventures, describing the breathtaking landscapes, the physical and mental endurance required, and the diverse cultures of the Himalayan region. His slideshow, featuring stunning images of snow-capped peaks and remote villages, brought the majesty of the Himalayas to life for our young learners.

The students were deeply engaged throughout the session, asking a variety of thoughtful questions. Mr Bansal answered each question with enthusiasm and patience, providing valuable lessons on resilience, cultural understanding, and the importance of setting goals. 


To me CIS is my home, a place that I call my own – a place that motivates, inspires and ignites a sense of purpose and passion within me.


