# Session conducted by Dr. Kaushik Ghosh on "Osteo Insights"

Dr. Kaushik Ghosh, a renowned orthopedic surgeon, delivered an engaging 'Osteo Insights' session for Grade 3 learners, exploring the fascinating world of bones and their functions. He educated and sparked curiosity about bone health, discussing common issues like osteoporosis and fractures, and how medicines can help. Dr. Ghosh emphasized a balanced diet, regular exercise, and proper calcium intake for strong bones. The session concluded with an interactive Q&A session where students asked him thoughtful questions and Dr. Ghosh provided insightful answers, encouraging further learning and prioritizing bone health.









## Shadow Theatre Workshop

#### Grade 4

Shadow theatre, also known as shadow puppetry, is one of the oldest storytelling art forms, tracing its origins back to over 2,000 years. It involves using flat, cut-out figures (puppets) held between a light source and a screen. The puppeteer manipulates these figures, creating moving shadows that bring stories to life. Often accompanied by music, narration, and sound effects, it is both a visual and auditory experience that captivates audiences through its simplicity and creativity.

The Junior section of the Calcutta International School decided to give this unique experience to its students through a 3 day workshop facilitated by Ms Anna-Maria Schlemmer from Germany in collaboration with Mr Sudip Gupta of Dolls Theatre, Kolkata from 9th to 11th September, 2024 for the Grade 4 students.





The workshop began with a brief overview about shadow theatre and its history. Then the students were given bits of scrap paper which they used to make forms of fairies, animals, monuments, monsters and many more. This created a seamless blend of abstract and realistic figure making.

On the second day the students were grouped under various themes such as Water, Sun, Jungle, House etc. They started making the background according to these themes and weaved their own unique stories around them. Themes like environmental conservation and human resilience were subtly interwoven into the traditional storytelling framework.





## Shadow Theatre Workshop

#### Grade 4

The students were taught the masterful manipulation of light. They also learnt that various angles create intricate shadows, offering a multi-dimensional experience. The learners also experienced using coloured lighting to add depth and emotion, enhancing the overall visual appeal.

On the third day the students displayed their skills in puppetry in front of the students of Grades 3 and 5. Whether small or delicate figures or larger-than-life representations, each puppet moved with grace and fluidity.

Finally, it was time for Ms. Anna's performance. It was a splendid show that left all walking back to their childhood memory lanes. The absence of dialogues forced the audience to rely on visual metaphors and symbolism. This led them to engage more deeply into the story. Moments of different emotions were communicated through changes in shadow size, puppet movements, and shifts in lighting, creating a rich emotional experience.





While the children were enchanted by the visuals, the adults were captivated by the deeper themes. The sheer creativity of the visual design elicited audible gasps from the audience. There were moments when the shadows transformed in unexpected ways, keeping the viewers engaged and curious.

The 3 day workshop was a wonderful experience for the students. It served as a great learning experience and a reminder of how traditional art forms can still attract modern audiences when executed with care and creativity.

## Sessions conducted by the Counsellors

## Session on Respect and Boundaries in Everyday Life with Grade 4

School counsellors Farishta Dastur, Spriha Patronobis and Sukonna Halder conducted a session with Grade 4 students on Respect and Boundaries in Everyday Life. The session focused on the meaning of the term 'boundaries' in our interpersonal interactions. Boundaries do not only apply to the physical realm but also describes psychological space. It teaches us when, how and how much to engage with another person, keeping in mind how our own actions make the other person feel, therefore fostering a sense of safety and well-being for us and those around us.













Children spoke candidly about various scenarios where lack of boundaries could lead to risks and/or impact relationships, making them feel uncomfortable and hence creating misunderstandings. They were able to identify specific actions that indicate that we are mindful of taking consent and respecting one another's space.

## Sessions conducted by the Counsellors

#### Life Skill Session on Diversity and Boundaries by Spriha Patronobis

School counselor Spriha Patronobis conducted a Life Skills session for Grade 5 students to reiterate the concepts of Diversity and the Need for Boundaries. Students enthusiastically participated in group discussions on Diversity is an opportunity to enhance individuality, learn from one another, develop compassion, add variation to our experiences which enrich our lives and maintain an atmosphere of inclusion, where as non acceptance of differences can lead to lack of empathy, intolerance, and in severe instances, even criminal behavior. Children also learnt the need for having boundaries in interpersonal relationships - such boundaries are not meant to be divisive, but instill better safety for all of us. In this regard, the significance of Consent was also emphasized. It was encouraging to see that students were candid in sharing their own experiences and learning from those of others.





## Understanding Puberty

The continuation sessions of "Transitioning during Puberty" with Grade 5 was conducted on 11th September for the boys and on 20th September for the girls. It was done mainly as a Q & A session to provide answers to the queries of the students. The discussion topics ranged from pubertal changes to menstruation to reproduction and also about reproduction in a gender diverse population. The students engaged proactively in these discussions.





## Positive Parenting Workshop

#### Grade Pre Nursery

The parents of Grade Pre Nursery attended a workshop on 'Positive Parenting' with the school counsellors Mrs. Spriha Patronobis and Mrs. Farishta Dastur Mukerji, on 4th September, 2024.

The session focussed on various age appropriate concerns that children experience at this stage of development such as Daily Routine, Structure, Free Play, Screen time, Sleep schedules, Handling Behavioural and Emotional challenges, Discipline v/s Punishment, Reinforcements for Positive Behaviour, parents recognizing and addressing their own emotional triggers, helping children to develop frustration tolerance, helping children through transitions, to name a few.

Parents found the session not only interactive and informative, but were also appreciative of the safe space that was created for them to share their experiences and concerns, and engage in experiential learning as a cohort.

We hope this is the beginning of many such collaborative exchanges to come.









## Growing Up Together

## A Workshop for Grade 5 Parents on Navigating Puberty and Sex Education with Confidence

After a month-long conversation with students of grade 5 on Transitioning Through Puberty, it was time to include parents in the conversation. On 25th September, 2024, school counsellors Mrs. Spriha Patronobis and Mrs. Sukonna Halder conducted a session with the parents of the grade, to understand how these student sessions in school have impacted discussions at home. Recognizing the diverse spectrum of preparedness, comfort, knowledge, the workshop aimed at bringing all parents on the same page to address these matters in a consistent, age appropriate and de-stigmatizing manner. The interactive nature of the questions enabled parents to express their doubts pertaining to these topics. Through an interesting activity parents gained much insight into the questions put forward by the students, anonymously. This exercise helped parents to learn ways to respond to these queries. Related topics such as Gender and Sexual orientation, Boundaries, Consent, Interpersonal relationships, were also discussed. Some resources were shared with parents which serve as guidelines to create a safe space to continue these conversations at home.











# Sharing session of the workshop on Compassionate Systems Leadership

# Workshop on Scaffolding by the SEN Department

This served as an example of scaffolding, promoting independence by allowing teachers to revisit the material as needed.











The workshop emphasized how scaffolding fosters engagement and motivation by involving learners actively in their skill development. SEN department also shared strategies for effective scaffolding, using examples and demonstrating a sample worksheet tailored to different learners' needs.

The session concluded with each department planning a worksheet using the strategies on the specific format shared by the SEN Department.









# Corrigendum
