She conducted an interactive quiz, testing their knowledge of her previous works and the new release. Students enthusiastically participated, showcasing their love for her storytelling. Winners of the quiz were thrilled to receive signed copies of Dirty Mr. Orlando and the Murky Trap directly from the author herself. The event further strengthened Ms. Ranjan's connection with the young readers, who eagerly requested her to return next year with the next installment of both the Zynpagua series and her latest book. The visit was a memorable celebration of literature, creativity, and the joy of connecting with a beloved author.













Counselling sessions in Grades 1 & 2

Spreading Love and Acceptance and prioritising safety.

The School Counsellors. Farishta Dastur Mukerji and Sukonna Halder had conducted sessions with the Grade 2 on 30th October, 2024 on 'Inclusion and accepting differences'. The session focused on the concept of inclusion, aiming to help students understand the importance of accepting and supporting classmates with diverse abilities, backgrounds, and needs. The activity was designed to foster empathy, kindness, and respect while promoting an understanding of differences in a fun and engaging way. The students demonstrated an understanding of the concept of inclusion, with many commenting on the importance of helping others and treating everyone equally. The session tried to foster a sense of community, where students felt comfortable discussing their differences and expressing support for one another. The students actively participated in the discussion and contributed meaningfully. The class showed a good understanding of empathy, with several students mentioning how they could help others feel included in future activities.







On 19th December 2024, the school Counsellors conducted a session on body safety focusing on safe and unsafe touch, for Grade 1 students. The primary aim of the session was to educate young children about recognizing boundaries, understanding the importance of personal safety, and knowing how to respond in situations involving unsafe touch. Body safety is an important topic for young children, helping them understand their rights and how to protect themselves so they can stay safe and confident. The session included simple and interactive discussion about the human body and personal space, emphasizing the concept of body autonomy. The students were explained the difference between safe touches (those that make children feel cared for and comfortable) and unsafe touches (those that make them feel uncomfortable, scared, or confused). The session highlighted the importance of identifying trusted adults, such as parents, teachers, or caregivers, and encouraged children to share their feelings or concerns openly. Students were actively engaged through interactive questions and scenarios, which allowed them to practice recognizing and responding to unsafe situations. The session concluded with a reiteration of their right to feel safe and respected and a reinforcement of the key messages -a) Saying No firmly to any unsafe touch, b) Going away to a safe place and c) Telling a trusted adult about the incident immediately.







Wiping Out Bad Habits, One Poster at a Time!

The Junior School Student Council members took the lead in promoting good toilet etiquette among students in Grades 1-5. They delivered an informative talk, emphasizing the significance of maintaining clean toilets and encouraging responsible habits. The council members engaged with the students, addressing their questions and gathering feedback to further improve toilet facilities. Key topics discussed included water conservation, soap usage, and responsible toilet paper use. To reinforce their message, the council created eyecatching posters for the washrooms, serving as a reminder to students of the importance of practicing good toilet etiquette.

Times NJE Teacher Meet

On **22nd November**, Mrs. Antara Banerjee from the Junior School and Mrs. Elora Patra from the Senior School attended the annual *Times NIE Teacher Meet* in collaboration with RCC Institute of Information Technology (RCCIIT).

The discussions focused on the urgent need for integrating AI education at the school level, particularly for grades 8–12, to prepare students with future-ready skills. Workshop on Transformative learning - Sen Department


